Board of Directors

Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority July 20, 2021

Chairman, Thomas Wright, brought the regular monthly meeting of the MTAA Board of Directors to order at 3:00 PM with the following Board members present: Mike Munson and Brian Armstrong, with Erica Garcia-Babb via telephone conference. Lisa Stubbs was unable to attend. Also in attendance were:

Other staff members present were Eric Johnson, Cheryl Trobough and Danielle Sheehy.

Item 1. Notice.

Chairman Wright inquired if everyone who requested notification had been notified of this meeting. Ms. Trobough replied that notifications were sent.

Item 2. Approve Minutes of the MTAA's Regularly Scheduled Board Meetings of June 15, 2021.

Chairman Wright asked the Board to review the Minutes of the Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting held on June 15, 2021 and inquired if there were any additions, corrections or comments to the Minutes.

Mr. Munson moved to approve the Minutes of the Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting of June 15, 2021 as amended. Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 3. Public Comment

Chairman Wright inquired if there was anyone registered to speak during Public Comment. Mr. Johnson replied that there was not.

Item 4. Adopt the Agenda.

Chairman Wright inquired if there were any changes to the Agenda as presented. Mr. Munson made a motion to adopt the Agenda as presented. Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 5. Final Review of 2022 Budget and Authorization to Publish the Notice of Public Hearing.

Mr. Johnson presented Draft #3 of the 2022 Budget and the Notice of Budget Hearing provided by the State of Kansas for the completion and submission of the 2022 Budget.

The 2022 mill levy limit is determined by calculations performed by the County Clerk's office and it has been determined that 1.964 is the MTAA's "Revenue Neutral Rate" (RNR) as set forth in the legislation of Senate Bill 13.

Based upon the budget as presented, the mill levy for the 2022 budget is 1.928 and the MTAA's Ad Valorem tax levy will be \$3,540,792. It has been confirmed with the County Clerk's office that the November 1 Final Assessed Valuation would have to **decrease** \$33.9 million of the \$66.3

million that was increased in the July 1 Estimated Assessed Valuation before the MTAA would exceed the RNR.

Plans are to publish the notice immediately on the MTAA website and in the Topeka Metro News on July 26 to satisfy the requirement of publication ten (10) days prior to the Public Hearing on August 10, 2021.

Mr. Munson made a motion to adopt the 2022 MTAA Budget and authorized Certification to the Shawnee County Clerk. Ms. Garcia-Babb seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 6. Consider Berberich Trahan & Company P.A. Engagement Letter for 2021, 2022 and 2023 Audits.

Mr. Johnson reported that the Audit Report for 2020 presented in May was the third year of the three-year contract.

The Board was provided an engagement letter from BT&Co. for auditing services for the fiscal years of 2021, 2022 and 2023. The contract costs are proposed as \$20,800 for 2021; \$21,300 for 2022; and \$21,850 for 2023.

Mr. Armstrong made a motion to approve the BT&Co. Engagement Letter for the 2021, 2022, and 2023 audits as presented. Mr. Munson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 7. Consider Approval of MTAA Resolution No. 21-277 Authorizing the Acceptance of an AIP Grant Offer Through Federal Aviation Administration.

Mr. Johnson reported that Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) recently surveyed airport sponsors to inquire if they would be in a position to process an expedited (100%) grant based on equipment price estimate vs. bid. This grant would be used to purchase foam testing equipment and cover the cost of retro-fitting existing ARFF vehicles. The purpose of the testing equipment is to test foam mixtures on ARFF trucks prior to discharging the systems (Input-based testing). The current method is to test foam that has been discharged on the ground (output-based testing).

Staff obtain an estimate from NoFoam Systems for the Series 500 portable system, tank, hoses, hydrant meter and retro-fit kits for three (3) ARFF trucks. The anticipated cost, including shipping, is \$38,685.29.

In the event this grant offer is made, it will need to be turned around without delay. Mr. Johnson requested the Board of Directors to consider adoption of MTAA Resolution No. 21-277, which authorizes the MTAA President to sign in acceptance of a grant offer from the FAA in an amount not to exceed the estimate of \$38,685.29 as received.

Mr. Munson made a motion to adopt MTAA Resolution No. 21-277 authorizing Eric Johnson to sign a grant offer from the FAA in the amount of Thirty-Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars and Twenty-Nine Cents (\$38,685.29) for funding to cover the expense of input-based testing equipment. Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 8. Consider Purchase of AFFF Concentrate to Replenish Depleted Stock for Emergency Fire Response.

Mr. Johnson reported that on July 8, 2021, there was a large spill at the fuel farm at Topeka Regional Airport. The last estimate provided by the fire department was in excess of 3,000 gallons of Jet A fuel. With an event like this, the primary response is to blanket the fuel to reduce the vapors and the potential for fire. Foam blankets break down quickly and require periodic reapplication. During this process, the MTAA Fire Department used approximately 1,000 gallons of foam concentrate.

The MTAA Fire Department was able to borrow enough foam from another airport to maintain compliance with FAA regulations with the understanding the need to return it or replace it within 30 days. Staff obtained several quotes to replenish the required inventory of foam. Danko Emergency Equipment provided the lowest quote of \$24,721.28. Some of this will be used to replace the foam borrowed from the 190th ARW Fire Department.

Mr. Johnson requested the Board of Directors to authorize the purchase of 1,035 gallons of PHOSCHEK 3% AFFF from Danko Emergency Equipment at a cost of \$24,721.28.

The cost of replenishing the supply will be submitted to the responsible insurance provider for reimbursement.

Mr. Munson made a motion to authorize the purchase of 1,035 gallons of PHOS-CHEK 3% AFFF from Danko Emergency Equipment at a cost of Twenty-Four Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-One Dollars and Twenty-Eight Cents (\$24,721.28). Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Information Only Items: Item 7. Monthly Reports

7.a. Aviation-Related Issues & Air Service – Mr. Johnson

Mr. Johnson provided the following report:

- A representative from the City of Topeka will be joining Mr. Johnson at Volaire's air service forum August 11th through the 13th. There will be an opportunity to meet with several airlines to present what the Topeka community has to offer.
- Following the airline meeting, the FAA's 4-States conference is planned for August, 26th and 27th. This is the first conference since 2019 and a lot of new information is expected to be shared.
- There's a lot of confusion with the most recent pandemic grants. As you know, the Board authorized staff to move forward with a project to modify the sterile area of the terminal building pending FAA approval. Notification was received from FAA on June 29th that it was an eligible project. Today, notice was received that the project would not be able to be completed under the CRSSAA Grant because the opportunity to convert the funds for a development project expired on June 30th. The ARPA Grant will be available for this project and discussions have been had regarding this with the FAA Planner for Kansas. Either way, it appears there's a large portion of the grants that simply aren't available for the projects MTAA identified.

7.b. Economic Development & Leasing Activity – Mr. Johnson

Mr. Johnson provided the following report:

- MTAA is working with a prospective tenant for a lease on Building 260. They have agreed with the price and are reviewing the lease for signature.
- There is also a prospective tenant for Building 657. This would be a long-term tenant considering a substantial investment in tenant buildout to the building.
- DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS (as of 06/30/2021)
 - Paul Kirk dba Advance Street Rod Design Account remains delinquent for a portion of the October invoice and finance charges;
 - Mid America Painting Delinquent for June invoice & finance charges;
 - R&R Pallet Account remains delinquent for Finance Charges not paid from October through June;
 - ➤ <u>Rural Development Corporation</u> Partial payments were received for the March, April, May & June, July and August 2020 invoices. Finance charges on unpaid balances each month. All unpaid charges relate to Blda. #624.
 - Vaerus Aviation Inc. Delinquent for May & June invoices & finance charges.

Mr. Johnson provided the following report on <u>June Leasing Activity:</u>

 - The Home Depot USA has leased a fourth parking lot.

- The current monthly rental income is \$169,875 which is approximately \$2,038,494 per year.

7.c. Monthly Financial Reports – Ms. Trobough

Ms. Trobough provided the following report:

- The report for the month ending <u>06/30/2021</u> reflects revenue to be \$65,333 ahead of the budget which is a net result from:
 - a. Taxes and Assessments receipts reflects to be \$22,256 less than the anticipated budgeted;
 - b. Landing Fees income shows to be \$18,350 less than budgeted;
 - c. Fuel Flowage Fees are \$4,504 more than the anticipated budgeted;
 - d. Passenger Facility Charges are under budget by \$4,327;
 - e. Lease & Rental Fees actual income is \$111,834 more than budgeted;
 - f. Reimbursements total to be \$4,597 more than budgeted;
 - g. CD Interest income is \$1,580 under budget;
 - h. Water/Sewer Sales are \$340 less than budgeted with Water/Sewer Costs reflecting to be \$13,836 more than the budgeted costs.
- Overall, the operating expenses ended the year with a favorable budget variance of \$285,865.
- Capital Improvement purchases made during the month of June are as follows:
 - **a. COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT** Purchase of batteries for radios donated by SNCO Emergency Management at a cost of **\$825.00**.

Mr. Munson moved to accept and file the Monthly Financial Reports as presented for the month ended June 30, 2021. Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Item 11. Executive Session

Chairman Wright inquired if there was a need for an Executive Session. Mr. Resner and Mr. Johnson responded that there was not.

Adjournment

Mr. Munson wanted to express what a great event he felt the air show turned out to be. Mr. Johnson stated that he will request Brooks Pettit to be at the August board meeting to provide a brief air show summary.

Chairman Wright asked if there was any further business to discuss, hearing none, he asked for a motion to adjourn. Mr. Munson made the motion to adjourn. Mr. Armstrong seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned at 3:40 p.m.
